SALMON IN THE CLASSROOM

The Rapid River School is participating once again in the SIC (Salmon in the Classroom) Program. We received our eyed eggs from the Thompson Fish Hatchery in November. The kids enjoy watching our Chinook salmon go through each stage of development: eyed egg to sac fry to swim up fry. We will start feeding the salmon in January when 80% are swimming up looking for food. The 5th and 6th graders work together to feed the fish and check water quality with weekly testing. We also have high school students that help with cleaning the tank and removing the eggs or fish that have died. We start each year with approximately 200 eyed eggs.

Mr. Ostrenga and Ms. Larson work together to teach our students about this process as the fish develop. In the spring, we will release our fish into the Whitefish River. The UP Sport Fisherman Group has been vital in sponsoring us with this program. They helped fund our very expensive chiller unit and other tools to help us maintain our tank to approximately 50 degrees F. The tank is in the high school biology lab if you are interested in stopping by.

UP HEALTH PROJECT

Our school is currently working with the UP Health Project. This project is designed to improve the overall health of our students, staff and community. We are currently working to write a grant to purchase two water refill stations for our building. These stations will help reduce plastic waste in our landfills and increase water consumption of all in our building.

We are also writing a grant to get students more active in and out of the classrooms. It is proven that increased heart rate activities improve academic performance. Activities that are a part of this project are; Take the Challenge curriculum, new cell phone policies, nutrition classes, go noodle, brain gym and the Playworks program in our P.E. classes and on our playground.
