COVID-19 UPDATE

Rapid River Rocket Families: As you are all hearing, there has been a substantial increase in the number of positive COVID 19 cases in Delta County. Here in the school, we have also seen an increase in positive cases, and as important, an increase in the number of close contacts who are required to quarantine. Our concern is twofold: we want to ensure that there is no spread of the virus within the building, and we want to ensure that we have enough staff to effectively cover the needs of our students.

Very thankfully, we have not yet had to seriously consider closing a grade level or an instructional wing of the building. We believe that our students and staff understand the need to be vigilant about hygiene, washing hands frequently or using hand sanitizer, wearing masks, and doing their best to maintain social distancing. For those students and staff who have had to quarantine, we certainly appreciate the effort that has been made to keep students engaged and to maintain remote learning.

This is a very challenging time, for families and for the school, but we know that by working together we can overcome and persevere. Please stay in contact with your child's teacher[s] and reach out directly to Principal Bill Warning.
