Minutes of the regular meeting of the Rapid River Board of Education held on November 8, 2021.

The meeting was called to order by President Brooke Johnson at 6:30 p.m. in the Tri-Township School Library. Members present: Travis Gustafson, Matt Holmio, Brooke Johnson; members absent: Steven Lenaker, James Olson, April Proehl, Betty Jo Proehl. Administrative members present: Jay Kulbertis, Rachal Gustafson, Matt Scheuren, Lisa Boudreau, Karen Fisher. Audience members: Doug Leisenring, Bobbi Ryan. Pledge of Allegiance was said by all.

DSISD Superintendent Doug Leisenring presented to the board what type and how much support the ISD provides Rapid River Schools. Superintendent Jay Kulbertis reviewed the finance committee meeting. Facilities, Grounds, and Transportation Manager Matt Scheuren noted that building maintenance is going good so far; waiting on bathroom repair parts, heating system is working, bus behavior is improving and looking for sub bus drivers and custodial workers. Principal Rachal Gustafson discussed start of quarter 2, elementary and middle school interventions, PTC attendance at the elementary and high school levels, and recent staff meeting discussions.

Superintendent Jay Kulbertis provided information on the special board meeting and nursing services from DSISD.
