EARLY COLLEGE PROGRAM

I am reaching out to you to provide some information about an exciting opportunity that is available to our students who plan to attend a Michigan College, especially Bay College. We have received approval from the Michigan Department of Education to offer an "Early College" experience. Because of our district's participation in the dual enrollment program with Bay College, we successfully launched the Early College as a pilot program two years ago. All of the student participants were able to benefit academically and financially. Now, we are continuing to expand the program, and increase the enrollment, to the benefit of our students at Rapid River. The Early College program is an effort by the State to support students and families in their struggle to meet the financial challenge of higher education. Here at Rapid River, we built a partnership with Bay College to offer dual enrollment with the same overall goal in mind. Now, with an Early College, we can enhance the dual enrollment program and expand the reach to more students.

The headline reads that the Rapid River Schools will pay the tuition for the first year of attendance at Bay College. Of course, it is a bit more complicated than that.

In essence, the Early College program involves a commitment by participants to fulfill an additional requirement to include an equivalent of a high school course credit during the first year of full-time college attendance. The participants are technically fifth-year high school students AND first-year college students. The trade-off is that we, as a district, will pay the college tuition, but we will also hold on to the high school diploma until the end of the 'extra' year. Nothing changes in regard to Commencement and graduation parties. Our Seniors will still celebrate the end of high school, like every other year.

I am sure that you have questions. If this sounds like something that you may be interested in learning more about, let's get together and discuss it. Bill Warning and I will be scheduling a meeting in the Fall with all interested parents of high school students. Since it is beneficial for our students and their families to begin planning early for college, we would like the parents of our underclassmen to consider attending.
