SCHOOL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS Special Mtg., March 2, 2010

Key Club Advisor Linda Froberg presented information regarding the planned Key Club Convention trip to Green Bay, WI March 5-7.

Superintendent Mileski reviewed the 2010/11 General Fund budget and the need to make budgetary reductions. She also reviewed the proposed budgetary reductions/ revenue enhancements.

Lengthy discussion followed regarding many items including becoming more efficient, secretarial/clerical time, the ½ time superintendent's position for 2010/11, technology needs and costs, consolidating services I.S.D. wide, the use of volunteers, working a day or days without pay and possible pay freezes and health insurance concessions.

Band instructor Jeff Ingraham presented his thoughts regarding cutting the band/music program.

Technology and secretary/ clerical positions were discussed again. Technology Consultant Henry Knoch will provide information to the board regarding services he provides. Superintendent Mileski will meet with secretarial staff to discuss their duties.

Superintendent Mileski told board members that decisions should be made at the March regular board meeting.

During Audience Communications Linda Froberg announced that there will be a basketball clinic held June 14-17, 2010 with the coaches being from the Detroit Pistons basketball team.

Mrs. Mary Knoch, high school science teacher, was recognized for receiving "Teacher of the Year Award" from the American Legion, Department of Michigan Education and Scholarship Committee. **Motion made and approved:** -to approve the Key Club trip to Green Bay, Wisconsin March 5-7. -to reduce the school nurse time from 7 hours per day to 6 hours per day.

Regular Mtg., March 15, 2010

Superintendent Terri Mileski updated board members on the following:

-The legislature will begin debate to significantly reform Michigan's state employee and public school employee retirement systems.

-There were six responses regarding publishing the Reach Out Rapid River. All six wanted the Reach Out to continue to be published.

-Work continues on the Master Class Schedule. Mid Pen would still like to send students to our school for physics.

-A Policy & Personnel Committee meeting will be scheduled for after spring break to review the Athletic Committee's recommendations regarding the athletic handbook and to review NEOLA policy updates. -There will be a Winter Sports Banquet April 13, at 6:30 p.m. which is being organized by the Fan Club.

There was discussion regarding the budgetary reductions. The possibility of eliminating the band/music program was discussed at length. There were audience comments from Traci Tardiff, Brent Berglund, Linda Froberg, Ben Swanson and Amber Froberg who did not think it would be wise to cut band.

There was also discussion regarding reducing the number of student attendance day by lengthening the day. Board members concurred that this would not be in the best interest of students. Superintendent Mileski requested that secretarial positions and technology services be addressed at a later date. Senior class member Amber Froberg explained the proposed senior class trip itinerary to Gurnee, Illinois May 25-26.

Key Club members reported on their Key Club Convention trip and showed the first place winning video of George Reinwand's Pearl Harbor experience.

President Kate Ignat appointed Karen Lundquist to the 2010 Scholarship Selection Committee.

During Audience Communications Lori Shope requested help with opening up the concession stands during the track meets.

Motion made and approved: -to not cut the band/music program. -to approve the senior class trip. -to approve the 2009/10 General Fund and Food Service Budget revisions. -to hire Paul Brunngraeber as Junior High Boys' Track Coach and Kurt Almonroeder as Junior High Girls' Track Coach.

-to accept the \$70 donation from the American Legion Post #301 to be used for laminating, \$130 from Richard & Edie Spriks to be used for library purchases in memory of their daughter, Megan Marohnic, and \$200 from New Page for volunteer work done in the district by John Pajnich to be used by the Athletic Department. -to allow Sandy Deneau & Diane Kuchan to adjust the time for written notice to 30 days if they resign from the district in order to participate in the Consolidated Business Services Plan. -to consider Mr. Henry Knoch as part-time superintendent for the 2010-2011 school year to be approved at the April 19, 2010 Board of Education meeting.
