## SCHOOL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

Regular Mtg., December 21, 2009
Superintendent Terri Mileski updated board members on the following:
-the Athletic Focus Group is scheduled to meet January 7. The group will prepare a list of recommendations for the Board to consider as they work on budget concerns for the 2010/11 school year.
-the Annual Delta Schoolcraft I.S.D. Board of Education dinner meeting is scheduled for February 10. Kathy Hayes, with MASB, will present on Superintendent/Board communication and relations.
Motion made and approved:
-to approve the Resolution to Conduct Annual November School Board Elections.
-to approve the Resolution Amending the 403(b) Exclusive Benefit Plan.
-to hire Lollie Eskofski as National Honor Society Advisor.
-to approve the Resolution to Enter into a Consolidated Service
Agreement with the Michigan
Department of Education.
-to approve the Resolution to
Participate in the Michigan School
Readiness Program.
-to authorize Superintendent Terri
Mileski to enter into the
Memorandum of Understanding required by the Michigan Race to the Top grant if the Delta Schoolcraft I.S.D. superintendents decide to do so.
-to accept the resignation of board member Wendy Holzenkamp effective December 31, 2009.

## Special Mtg., January 11, 2010

Superintendent Mileski reviewed the General Fund budget history and possible reductions and revenue enhancements for the 2010/11 school year. She also noted the fund balance history.

Board Trustee Larry Sundling reported on the Athletic Focus Group golf outing fundraiser that is planned for June 12, 2010 at the Gladstone Golf Course.

Eliminating athletic transportation for events that are less than 50 miles away was discussed. This would virtually eliminate junior high athletic transportation as none of their events are more than 50 miles away. The possibility of eliminating scrimmage transportation was also mentioned. Reducing athletic transportation would create a savings of approximately $\$ 6,500$.

Outsourcing of business services was discussed. Mid Pen, Gladstone and Escanaba have all been approached, but to date this has not been successful.

Superintendent Mileski explained that she will be meeting with Mid Pen to work out details of exchanging Physics and Advance Math classes to Mid Pen students for the transportation they provide for our I.S.D. students.

Principal Bill Warning explained the possibility of eliminating the band/music program. Several negatives were mentioned by board members.

Principal Bill Warning explained that due to declining enrollment special education teachers could be reduced from 2.8 F.T.E.'s to 2.0 F.T.E.'s. Several negatives were mentioned by board members. Special Education teachers Flo Kuehl and Shireen McLaughlin explained how this would affect the special education program.

Principal Bill Warning explained that due to declining enrollment 2 or 3 classes could be eliminated from the Master Class Schedule. Some of this would have been done regardless of the budget concerns.

Due to declining enrollment Director of Non-Instructional Personnel Kevin Beaver recommends that food service time be reduced one hour per day. The savings would be
approximately $\$ 2,900$.
Changing the annual election to November should save the district approximately $\$ 2,000$ and eliminating board member pay would save $\$ 2,100$.

The Great Start Readiness Program revenue can be flowed through from the Headstart program to our district this year only which is a revenue enhancement of $\$ 6,800$.

There was further discussion regarding outsourcing business services as well as discussion regarding reducing the number of classes, class size, Compass Learning, instructional cuts vs. non-instructional cuts, athletic pay to participate, eliminating junior varsity volleyball, lunch time supervision and contracting with a retired Superintendent for part time Superintendent services.

Board members discussed the Race To The Top Memorandum of Understanding at length.

During Audience Communication Flo Kuehl thanked the board for allowing the audience to communicate freely during the work session. Ruth Schwartz questioned if there had been consideration given to lengthening the day and reducing the number of days of student attendance.

-to enter into the Race To The Top Memorandum of Understanding.

## Regular Mtg., January 18, 2010

Superintendent Terri Mileski updated board members on the following:
-Reported on the Delta Schoolcraft I.S.D. Superintendent's Roundtable meeting. Items discussed were career tech and general education services, the $3^{\text {rd }}$ party employer to pay substitutes and a negotiations workshop to be held on March 3, 6:30 p.m. at the I.S.D.
-Mike Koster, Superintendent of the Delta Schoolcraft I.S.D. will be invited to attend the January 27, 2010 work session to discuss consolidation of business services.
-Continue to plan with Mid Peninsula School to share academic
programming and to continue sharing I.S.D. transportation and the football cooperative.
-recognized board members for their dedication to the district.

Teachers Traci Tardiff and Kim Viau presented a book that will be donated to the library to recognize the board members service to the district. Board members, Superintendent Mileski and Principal Warning were presented cards of thanks and Rocket bars thanking them for their service.

Under Old Business 2010/11 budgetary considerations were discussed. Several items were discussed including shortening the calendar/lengthening the day, consolidation of services and possible retirements.

Mr. Mark Blau and Mrs. Karen Lundquist, applicants for the vacant board position, were interviewed by the Board of Education.

Adherence to the district's athletic policy was discussed. This matter was referred to the Policy \& Personnel Committee.

During Audience
Communications Teacher Traci Tardiff shared with board members a list of possible budget reductions to be considered by board members, support staff personnel Ruth Schwartz expressed concern that shortening the school year only personally and financially impacts support staff as teachers do not have their pay reduced when this happens and teacher Kim Viau voiced concern that the elementary parking lot was very slippery.

## Motion made and approved:

-to appoint Karen Lundquist to the vacant board position until December 31, 2010. -to retain Thrun Law Firm as legal counsel at a cost of $\$ 1,100$ for 2010.
