SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

At our February 15 Board of Education meeting, the Board made a very difficult decision. Based upon my recommendation, they approved moving the superintendent's position from full-time to part-time. It was a tough decision, but with declining enrollment, inadequate funding from the State and rising costs in all areas, it was the right thing to do. Making this difficult decision in February, allows us time over the next few months to plan a budget for 2010/11 that will give our kids the best programming we can offer considering our financial resources.

The Board gave me the option to stay as a part-time superintendent, but at this time in my life I'm not ready to retire and work part-time. My mother is 85 and still works 3 -4 days a week with kids at a special education school in Grand Rapids. I hope I can be that lucky to have the energy and zest for life and still be able to positively impact kids when I'm that age. It's been a great experience to be a Rocket and it's not over yet. We still have much work to do in the months to come. I was encouraged by the discussion at our February meeting that we can all work together to do what's best for kids. We all have our own children so we know how important school is (or was) to them - the staff, the learning environment, and the activities. If we can continue to

remember that Rapid River kids are counting on us to do what's best, then we will have done our job and given our students the future they deserve.

Working together to solve the challenges that we face will make a difference. I grew up in a non-athletic family, but after almost 36 years of being married to a coach, I have come to love and appreciate the lessons we can all learn from athletics (especially football). I'll leave you with one of my favorite quotes from Vince Lombardi (for you non-football fans, he is the late great coach for the Packers during their golden years). This quote sums up what I believe we need to do to not only survive these tough times, but to thrive:

Individual commitment to a group effort - that is what makes a team work, a company work, a society work, a civilization work.

My years at Rapid River as a teacher and now as superintendent have been very rewarding. I know that whatever school district I am superintendent for next year, I will always remember the great foundation that Rapid River Public Schools gave me. I will always cherish the memories of the people and students I have been privileged to know over the years.

Please encourage our legislators to make equity and adequacy in funding education their top priority. They need to hear from all of us, but especially students, parents, and the community that education should be the number one priority in Michigan's economic recovery plan.

Let's stay positive, work together, and remember that every day is a good day when you are a Rocket.

SCHOOL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

Special Mtg., January 27, 2010

Board member Larry Sundling provided those present with information regarding the Athletic Focus Group. It was noted that the Golf outing fundraiser date was changed to June 24, 2010 at the Gladstone Golf Course.

Eliminating athletic transportation for events that are less than 50 miles away was discussed. Reducing athletic transportation would create a savings of approximately \$6,500. These two items are endorsed by the Athletic Focus Group and are being done to avoid the cutting of any of the sports.

Superintendent Mileski explained that exchanging Physics and Advanced Math classes to Mid Pen students for transportation they provide for our I.S.D. students should occur next year. Timing needs to be worked out, but it is felt this is possible.

Compensating substitute teachers through a 3rd party employer will begin this spring. This is estimated to save approximately \$1,500 annually.

The band/music program was discussed. Board members felt that other reductions should be made first and this should be the last reduction made if necessary.

Principal Bill Warning updated board members that he met with the special education teachers. Special education teaching time will be dependent upon the I.E.P.'s. This will not be known until we get closer to the next fiscal year.

The Master Schedule was discussed. Declining enrollment should allow for 2 or 3 classes to be eliminated from the schedule which will be a savings to the district.

There was discussion regarding the following: reducing one hour of work time from the food service department due to declining enrollment, changing the annual election to November should save approximately \$2,000, that board members not be compensated and the possibility of all staff giving up one day of pay. It was noted that all employees of the district should make concessions in this time of financial crisis.

The Great Start Readiness Program revenue can flow through from the Headstart program to our district this year only which is a revenue enhancement of \$6,800.

Board member Larry Sundling wants the administrators notified within the 90 day timeframe that their contracts will be opened. Board treasurer Dawn Gustafson pointed out that the administrative contracts are reviewed annually.

There was further discussion regarding athletics including the possibility of reducing coaching time and ways to change the Technology Consultant contract to create a savings.

Superintendent Mileski brought up the option of the Superintendent position being a part time position. This would mean she would look elsewhere for a position and the district would contract part time with a retired superintendent. She asked that board members make a decision regarding this at the February regular board meeting.

Consolidation of business services with Gladstone for the period from February 1 – June 30, 2010 was discussed at length. There was concern regarding the short timeframe, but this is a unique situation that could help us judge if this could continue into the next year.

During Audience Communications: Bus driver Martha Beaver wondered why bus driver time could just be cut without discussion and the food service reduction has been discussed and questioned so much, Sandy Sauve felt that the teaching staff has had to do more so everyone should have to do so and Chris Quinn posed a question regarding the current snowplowing arrangement versus how it was done in the past.

Regular Mtg., February 15, 2010

Superintendent Terri Mileski updated board members on the following:

- -Governor Granholm's Executive Budget proposal for 2010/11.
- -The Race To The Top grant and governor's proposed changes to the retirement system are hot topics right now.
- -Enrollment continues to decrease which seriously reduces revenue to the General Fund budget.
- -Scheduled a board work session for March 2, 2010 at 6:00 p.m. in the school library.
- -Reported on the Delta Schoolcraft I.S.D. Superintendent's Roundtable meeting.

Kate Ignat, Karen Lundquist, and Debbie Pajnich reported on the Delta Schoolcraft I.S.D. annual school board dinner meeting held February 10.

Mike Koster, Superintendent of the Delta Schoolcraft I.S.D. presented information to board members regarding collaboration and sharing of services taking place in our Intermediate School District.

President Kate Ignat appointed Karen Lundquist to the Finance Committee and the Policy & Personnel Committee.

The Senior Class Trip was discussed briefly. The Seniors will bring their itinerary to the March 15, 2010 board meeting to be reviewed.

The annual Key Club Convention to be held in Green Bay, Wisconsin March 5-7, 2010 was discussed. The Key Club members will bring more information regarding the trip to the March 2, 2010 Work Session.

During Audience Communications Flo Kuehl had a question regarding Algebra being taught at the Intermediate School District and Roxanne Soderstrom inquired about the success of the recent health fair.

- -to elect Larry Sundling as Vice President of the Rapid River Board of Education.
- -to accept the notifications of intent to retire from Shireen McLaughlin and Mary Knoch.
- -to accept the \$100 donation from the Relic Riders for the junior high football program and \$200 from the Rapid River Lions' Club for the Reading Buddies program. -to regretfully reconfigure the

superintendent's position to a part time position for 2010/11.
