# SCHOOL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

#### Regular Mtg., March 21, 2011

Superintendent Henry Knoch updated the board members on the following:

-the 2010/11 school calendar has been adjusted.

-the Hannahville Indian Community 2% grant requesting funding for a new elementary reading series has been drafted. It will be reviewed, revised if necessary, and submitted prior to the March 31, 2011 deadline.

-the Michigan Association of School Administrators has launched an 11 week, "Stop the Raid" campaign to provide members with information, specific action items and tools they can use to engage their communities and legislators in opposing the proposed raid on the School Aid Fund. The association agrees in principle with the shared sacrifice model, but the current raid on the School Aid Fund will unfairly burden school districts and will harm their ability to educate children well.

Andy and Cathy Claes, of the Delta Schoolcraft I.S.D., presented information regarding the Response to Intervention Program. There was lengthy discussion between the presenters, board members and audience.

Senior Katy Michaelson, along with Senior Class Advisor Roxann Hebert, presented the itinerary for the proposed senior class trip to Kalahari Resort located in the Wisconsin Dells, Wisconsin. Board members requested that all funding for the proposed trip be collected and further details regarding the itinerary be provided at the April regular board meeting.

During audience communications Kim Viau told board members that the "Sock Hop" sponsored by the Rapid River Lions' Club was well received by the students. Others present mentioned that their children had enjoyed the event as well. Jenny Ware inquired whether any progress had been made regarding co-oping of academics with neighboring schools. There was further discussion regarding this, particularly in the area of foreign language which will be a required course for the current 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> graders. **Motion made and approved:** 

-to approve the 2010/11 General Fund and Food Service budget revisions. -to table the Senior Class Trip request until the April 2011 regular board meeting.

-to regretfully accept the resignation of Kurt Almonroeder as Girls' Junior High Track Coach.

-to hire Kim Viau as Girls' Junior High Track Coach.
