## SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

The Rapid River Public Schools were able to take advantage of current low interest rates and recently completed the successful sale of its 2012 Refunding Bonds. The proceeds of these bonds were used to refund a portion of the outstanding School District's 2005 Refunding Bonds. The 2012 Refunding Bonds will save the taxpayers of the district approximately $\$ 445,018$ in interest payments over the remaining life of the bonds. The 2005 bonds were also refunding bonds from the 1999 bond issue when the Tri-Township building was expanded to house all of our students. The combined savings of the two refundings of the original 1999 Bonds is saving taxpayers over $\$ 860,000$ in interest over the life of the 1999 Bonds.
