# SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

It is a pleasure to be writing my inaugural piece as the Superintendent of the Rapid River Public Schools. There are a number of important items I want to be certain you are aware of.

First, the Rapid River Lions Club will once again be hosting the annual activities fund raising dinner, on October 20. Doors open at 4:00 p.m. with dinner at 5:00 p.m. Tickets are \$10 for adults; \$5 for students aged 6-10; five and under are free. There will be raffles, drawings, and activities for the kids. Please plan to support this important fund raiser, as all of the proceeds for this event go directly to support the student activities at the Rapid River Schools.

You will be seeing a school related ballot question in November that requires your support. It is time to renew our Non-Homestead Millage. This is NOT a new tax, NOT an increase, and NOT applied to family homes. This standard millage, on non-homestead properties, has been around since the adoption of Proposal A, and is an essential component of the school's operational revenue. Your support is greatly appreciated.

There are a couple of "new faces" in the elementary classrooms, although they may be quite familiar to some. Karen Wolf, who has been working in Title I in the district, and Amanda Spreitzer, who has been working with Headstart, are now part-time classroom teachers. This is an excellent instructional intervention to address the academic needs of our young learners. We welcome Karen and Amanda and wish them well with this new challenge.

# SCHOOL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

# Regular Mtg., August 20, 2012

Zach Anderson, representing the graduated Class of 2012, presented an American flag to the board which was flown over the United States capitol on July 8, 2012 in honor/memory of Col. Joseph P. Micks. President Lundquist thanked those present from the class for such a special donation.

Principal Bill Warning updated board members on behalf of the superintendent as follow:
-notified board members that Northstar Staffing has had some resignations and hires. Kurt Almonroeder, Assistant Varsity Football Coach, and Lauren Marshall, J.V. Girls' Basketball Coach have resigned. New hires by Northstar are Michelle Carne, Varsity Girls' Basketball Coach, and Tyler Kuehl, Assistant Varsity Football Coach.

# Motion made and approved:

- -to approve the Dual Superintendency Cooperative Agreement with Gladstone Area Schools.
- -to appoint Karen Lundquist and Sally Guay to the Gladstone/Rapid River Dual Superintendency Council.
  -to change the date of the regular meetings to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m.
- -to accept the resignation of Henry Knoch as superintendent effective immediately.
- -to accept the resignation of Bus Driver Terry Asplund effective immediately. -to proceed with a February 2013 election for a bond proposal. -to hire Integrated Designs as the architectural firm to oversee the project. -to give the softball program permission
- to construct a 10' x 16' building near the ball field.

  -to certify the 2012 tax levies as 18.00 non-homestead: 4.18 mills for the 2012
- non-homestead; 4.18 mills for the 2012 debt and 2.82 mills for the 2007 debt. -to opt in to Schools of Choice Section 105 and 105c except for the kindergarten grade level for the 2012/13 school year.
- -to accept the generous donation of \$1,850 from the Rapid River Memorial Day Parade Committee (\$700 to their

scholarship principal plus \$500 to this year's scholarship as well as \$300 to Reading Buddies and \$350 to the library. **Regular Mtg., September 10, 2012** 

Superintendent Jay Kulbertis reiterated the value of the Council while transitioning to the new dual superintendency. He also commented how helpful and creative staff have been as the school year begins.

Mrs. Joy McKnight presented the 2011/12 Annual Education Report.
