SPORTS PHYSICALS

Annual sports examinations will be May 8 at 5:30 p.m. for girls and 7:15 p.m. for boys at the Gladstone High School.

The bus for the girls will leave the school at 5:00 p.m. and return at approximately 6:45 p.m. The boys will leave at 6:50 p.m. and return at approximately 8:45 p.m.

Proper attire MUST be worn. This consists of a loose fitting short sleeve t-shirt/tank top, loose gym shorts and gym shoes (absolutely NO sandals). The examiners have to be able to easily see the upper and lower arms, the shoulders, the knees, and the ankles.

REMINDER: Any student who will be in 7th grade for the 2013/14 school year will be required to have an office based physical exam by their family physician in order to participate in athletics and school physical examinations in future years. Please have physicals done over the summer and drop off a copy to the H.S. office.
