SCHOOL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS Regular Mtg., August 12, 2013

Superintendent Jay Kulbertis updated board members as follows:
-the bond project is underway – most carpeting is installed and sidewalk replacement is taking place now.
-the consolidation of Rapid River's and Gladstone's business offices has already begun in preparation for the retirement of Rapid River's business manager.

Motion made and approved:

-to certify the 2013 tax levies as 18.00 non-homestead mills; 2.80 mills for the 2012 (original 1999 debt), 1.85 mills for the 2007 debt and 1.75 mills for the 2013 debt.

-to approve the administrative contracts for 2013/14 and 2014/15.

Regular Mtg., September 9, 2013

Superintendent Jay Kulbertis updated board members as follows:
-met with Bay College Staff to review student evaluations and to develop a method to track high school graduates.

Mrs. Joy McKnight presented the 2012/13 Annual Education Report.

Motion made and approved:

- -to approve the purchase of the man lift from Midway Rentals in the amount of \$24,592.
- -to approve retrofitting the kitchen sink in the main cafeteria by MG Mechanical in the amount of \$4,800.
- -to approve the 2013/2014 Best practices Resolution as presented.
- -to approve the bid from Nasi Roofing in the amount of \$167,500 to install a mechanically fastened membrane roofing system over existing shingles and wood deck of the pitched roof. Motion did not carry.
- -to approve the bid from Rapid Electric in the amount of \$87,439 to install new site lighting.
- -to approve the bid from Range Telecommunications in the amount of \$15,139.24 for the high school gymnasium sound system. -to approve the bids from KI Furniture
- -to approve the bids from KI Furniture and HPS, Inc. for cafeteria and miscellaneous tables for a total cost of approximately \$21,000.
- -to authorize Superintendent Kulbertis to develop a contract for the Assistant Business manager position.
