ELEMENTARY NEWS
In January, our elementary staff once again gave the Dibels Assessments to determine all students' progress. Nice gains were made! This was also the time we discussed and looked over the reports to see where an individual student may need some extra help. We call these time periods "interventions", where small groups work on specific needs. We want all students to hopefully get the help they need. ## SALMON PROJECT

The Rapid River School is participating once again in the SIC (Salmon in the Classroom) Program. We went to get our eyed eggs from Thompson Fish Hatchery in November. The students have enjoyed watching our Chinook salmon go through each stage of development. We started with approximately 215 eyed eggs. We have approximately 200 swim up fry in our tank at this time.

Mr. Ostrenga and Ms. Larson work together to teach our students about the fish development process. In the spring, we release the fish into the Escanaba Harbor. The UP

Sport Fisherman group has been vital in sponsoring us with this program. They helped fund our chiller unit. The tank is in the high school biology lab if you are interested in stopping to see the progress of this project.
